Role of Nominators


Nominators are invited to nominate researchers, inventors, innovators in science, engineering, technology, or multi-disciplinary approaches to the VinFuture Prize. Nominators contribute voluntarily to the development of science by nominating inventors to the Prize. Each Nominator is eligible to submit a maximum of 4 nominations, one for each Prize category, including the Grand Prize and three Special Prizes for Female Innovators, Innovators from Developing Countries, and Innovators with Outstanding Achievements in Emerging Fields.

Updates from VinFuture Prize

The VinFuture Prize has officially opened the nomination portal for the second season from February 16th until May 17th, 2022. The 2022 season of VinFuture Prize, with the theme of "Reshaping and Reviving," is looking for scientific inventions and innovations that can help revive the world and build up sustainable development after the pandemic.

Since its official launch, the second season has received immense support from the global scientific community. As of April 29, 2022, 2500 organizations and individuals from more than 100 countries have accepted to be official nominators for the Prize. Highlights of the FAQs

1. Opportunity for All

Are early-career or indigenous scientists eligible to be nominated for VinFuture Prize?

Yes. There are no distinctions made between young, emerging, or established scientists; awards are made on the basis of the impact of the research on humanity and society. We are committed to supporting scientists from all backgrounds, regardless of their nationality, scientific areas, ethnic origin, or religious beliefs. Indeed, we are expanding our support for scientists from developing countries whose work can demonstrate a (potential) global impact.

2. Focus on Impacts

Research, discoveries, or innovations can have industrial, economic, or societal impacts. Does VinFuture Prize award research that has industrial or economic impacts?

We put a great emphasis on the impact on humanity. In some cases, modest impacts in the development stage or promissing potential impact on millions or billions of people in the future should be considered in the VinFuture review process. Besides, we believe that science should be affordable and accessible to all people, and the benefits should not just pertain to a particular group or class of people. While we recognize that technology and research have the potential to generate enormous economic rewards, VinFuture Prize still puts humanity at the heart of its mission.

3. Encouragement of New Science

How are emerging fields determined for the Special Prize for Innovators with Outstanding Achievements in Emerging Fields?

Emerging Fields are defined as fields with new technologies or innovative breakthroughs that can demonstrate the potential to address global issues and create a positive impact on humanity and society. While the impact of such research may not be immediate, it should be anticipated within the next 10-20 years.



As part of the sequence of activities for the second VinFuture Prize season, VinFuture Foundation has officially launched a series of six webinars in six different time zones around the world. This series of events aims to provide information directly to scientists across the globe, attract the most outstanding nominations to promote post COVID-19 reconstruction and sustainable development, and promote diversity and breadth in all potential areas.

The webinar series took place on Zoom on March 23 and 31, April 4, 8, 14 and 19 for US East, West Coasts, Europe, Africa, Oceania and Asia. We are very thankful to have the participation of Prize Council and Pre-Screening Committee Members, as well as VinFuture Prize Inaugural Laureates attending the sessions and addressing the questions from nominators. This valuable engagement has made VinFuture Prize and Foundation much more comprehensively perceived by nominators and scientists around the world.
